SOCCER OR FOOTBALL?

The endless question in this sport: Football or Soccer? Today we're answering it. Firstly, how often is it said in the world?

For football, 3.5 billion fans say it rather than soccer. Roughly 350 to 400 million people express the sport as soccer. The term "Football" is used in most parts of the world, mostly in Europe, South America, Africa and Asia. Meanwhile, the term "soccer" is used in North America and Oceania. In our class, out of 17 people (including the teacher), 13 say football and only 4 say soccer.

The term Football derives from middle English word Fotbal (Foot+Ball). The term soccer is surprisingly a British invention! It derives from an abbreviation of "association football" used during the 19th century. Even though both terms are correct and used in different parts of the world, we can say that football is the more traditional term.
